Coming soon to a location near you... NMSBVI proudly offers Summer Programs for your child!

For students with visual impairments, who are juggling the demands of academics, plus "extra" skills like O&M, and just life in general... it can be hard to squeeze it all into the school year. Our summer program allows students to work on skills there may not have been time to address during the school year.

NMSBVI summer classes will address VIspecific skills that can be challenging to teach during the school year. Skill areas include math, science, technology, independent living skills, and O&M.

Summer programs will be administered by educators from the NM School for the Blind & Visually Impaired (NMSBVI), and by your local school district's Teachers of the Visually Impaired and Orientation & Mobility Specialists.

As an added bonus, NMSBVI is in the planning stages of a fun and exciting trip to the beach-tentatively scheduled for July 17th-20th. To be eligible for the trip, students must:

- Successfully participate in one of the camps that NMSBVI will hold around the state and/or the week long camp in Alamogordo
- Have the maturity necessary to be away from home for four days
- Be able to manage their behaviors while away from home for four days
- Be cleared to attend by NMSBVI's Health Services, which does require doctor's clearance
- The plan is to leave from the NMSBVI campus in Alamogordo the morning of 7/17. We will look to have a northern transportation run on Thursday 7/16 to pick up students who did not attend the week long camp in Alamogordo. Parents may need to meet transportation at the Preschool in Albuquerque
