Dear NMSBVI Families,

The 2019-2020 School year has begun! I am looking forward to meeting and spending time with each of you! I realize that some of you will probably want to come to Alamogordo at times in order to see your child's classroom. We have an open door policy and welcome your visits!

If you are ever planning a visit to your child's classroom, we ask you to follow a few simple guidelines:

1. Please let us know about your visit in advance, so that we can alert you to any planned activities for that day.
2. Please remember that our primary goal is to educate your child—both during the day and after school hours. With that in mind, you are welcome to observe in the classrooms, but please do not engage in conversations with education staff or students during that time. This will allow the educational process to continue without interruption.
3. If you plan to visit your child in the dorm or in Health Services, please notify the dorm staff and Health Services staff in advance. Also, **please be aware of the need for our staff to protect the privacy of other students**, so staff may request that you avoid visiting at certain hours or may request that you meet in a different area.

How to Increase Communication with your Children at Home

The beginning of the school year gets busy! It's easy to fall into routine and forget to take the time to ask each other about our days; especially if communication skills are limited. Here are some great ways you can start a dialogue with your kids at home.

- Tell me one thing that happened at school today.
- How many friends did you meet?
- What was your favorite food at lunch?
- What was the funniest thing that happened today?

Sometimes, kids just want to be heard! We all play a role in facilitating communication and starting a conversation here at school and at home with our kids—how often do you get asked about YOUR day? If your child does not speak, touch bases with the teacher and know the answers so you can support your child's ability to respond. Have a tactile/visual object your child can touch to communicate a response. Give them your devoted attention as you wait and watch for a response (regardless of the form). It feels good to know someone cares! Communication counts!

Parents Reaching Out

I hope that the school year gets off to a wonderful start in your district! I am writing to remind you that **Parents Reaching Out (PRO)** is a no-cost resource for families of children with disabilities or at risk of disabilities within your community.

PRO is funded and authorized by the U.S. Office of Special Education (OSEP) as New Mexico's Parent Training and Information Center. In this role, we provide information, training and support to families of infants, toddlers, children, and youth with disabilities, birth to 26, help parents to participate effectively in their children's education and development and partner with professionals and policy makers to improve outcomes for all children with disabilities. Below are some highlights of our services:

- Individualized services to families are accessible in person or over the phone in English and Spanish and provide support groups, workshops and parent-to-parent matches and can be reached at (505)247-0192 or 1-800-524-5176.
- Our web site, <http://www.parentsreachingout.org>, has resources that may be helpful to families navigating the education of their child with disabilities.
- We coordinate an annual conference that both families and professionals (CEU's are available) find very valuable and can be supported with Title I funds.
- We also serve as New Mexico's Family to Family Health Care Information Center funded by the United States Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) and can provide information to families and staff on waivers, SSI and other resources.

Our goal is to partner with school districts to ensure the best possible outcomes for New Mexico children with disabilities. Please do not hesitate to contact us if we can support you in your efforts with trainings or workshops.
